Hello and welcome to the 69th Annual IEHA Fall Educational Conference!

A number of years ago, I heard a presentation that stuck with me. Not so much the presentation itself, but more so a single concept presented in passing. What's funny about this is the fact that I don't even recall the speaker, or the actual topic of the presentation. Something about this seemingly minor idea that was mentioned struck a chord within me however. In the planning of this year's conference, this concept continued to come to mind:

The Power of a Narrator.

Some would argue that we are spoiled by today's storytelling technology. When we watch a film, the writers, directors, and producers have the ability to completely paint a picture in our minds of what they wish for us to see and know. Through use of flashbacks, CGI, and massive budgets, they have the ability to tell complete stories. Some would argue this is actually a detriment to the storytelling process. After all, have you seen many movies that were better than the books they were based on? There's a missing link that is lost when technology takes over. That missing link is the use of our *imaginations*.

Back to the narrator. The narrator frames the story, setting certain parameters and providing critical details that one must be aware of. The narrator sets a broad path and directs the minds and imaginations of the individual audience members towards a mutual understanding. The narrator guides the audience on *how* to see things, perhaps how to feel, and guides towards what lens to use while viewing the world being presented. What the narrator provides is intentionally somewhat vague in many instances. Have you ever noticed this? It allows the audience members to fill in the blanks using their *imagination*... effectively customizing the story in each mind. It allows a person to see things through their own eyes and worldview, but tells us what lens to use while looking.

The theme for this year's conference is "Sharpening the Edges: The Power of One".

Within IEHA, we have the combined desire, know-how, and willpower to take on any Public Health problem that Indiana faces. Consider that for a moment. As iron sharpens iron, if we work TOGETHER, the power of one can become the power of MANY. This requires open minds. Sometimes, uncomfortable discussions. This is where the narrator comes into play. This year's theme doesn't have as much to do with a common set of presentations as it does a common choice of perspective. What could happen if you chose to be the iron needed in someone else's life, and provide them a bit of "sharpening"? What would we be capable of if everyone here today were to accept and acknowledge their own weaknesses, and be open to "being sharpened"? What could happen if you chose to be a part of the solution, each and every day, by combining your strengths with those of your colleagues in IEHA to improve the health of Indiana? Join me by beginning with the assumption that maybe we're wrong, and opening our eyes and ears to find the relevance and value in each presentation this year. Join me today in choosing a perspective that seeks to find the good, yet seeks to make it better....
